No. 325.—The following Order of His Majesty in Council, which appeared in the London Gazette of 3rd June, 1921, is published for general information.

The Order applies to Hongkong, and no legislation will be necessary to adapt its provisions to the circumstances of the Colony.

The Treaty of Peace Order, 1919, was published in the *Hongkong Gazette* of 9th January, 1920, and was modified by the Hongkong Legislature by Ordinance No. 3 of 1920

The Treaty of Peace (Amendment) Order, 1920, was published in the *Hongkong Gazette* of 29th October, 1920, and was modified by the Hongkong Legislature by Ordinance No. 15 of 1920.

The Treaty of Peace (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1920, was published in the *Hong-kong Gazette* of 1st April, 1921, and was modified by the Hongkong Legislature by Ordinance No. 7 of 1921.

The Treaty of Peace (Amendment) Order, 1921, was published in the *Hongkony Gazette* of 15th April, 1921, no legislation being necessary to adapt its provisions to the circumstances of the Colony.
