

### LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

**No. 362.**—His Majesty the KING has not been advised to exercise his power of disallowance with respect to the following Ordinances :—

Ordinance No. 9 of 1923.—An Ordinance to provide for the carrying on of the work formerly carried on by certain German societies and persons in the Colony of Hongkong, and to deal with certain property formerly held or administered by, or used in connection with the work of, such societies and persons in the Colony of Hongkong, and to provide for the control of the persons by whom the said work is to be carried on.

Ordinance No. 18 of 1923.—An Ordinance to authorise the publication of an edition of the Ordinances of the Colony, to be known as “The Ordinances of Hongkong, 1844-1923”, and to repeal the Statute Laws (New Revised Edition) Ordinance, 1911.

Ordinance No. 1 of 1924.—An Ordinance to amend further the Rents Ordinance, 1922.
