A European nursing sister or matron, who has served not less than 3 years in the Colony, and not less than 15 years in all as a qualified nursing sister or matron in the public service or in a public hospital, in the Colony or elsewhere, to which she was appointed by the Colonial Government or through the Overseas Nursing Association and who would not otherwise be entitled to a pension, gratuity or other retiring
