ORDINANCE No. 1 of 1903, (PUBLIC HEALTH AND BUILDINGS).

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 16 of the Public Health and Buildings Ordinance, 1903, the Sanitary Board makes the following addition to the By-laws under the heading "Dairies" set forth in Schedule B to the said Ordinance.

## Addition.

Add to the By-laws under the heading "Dairies" in the said Schedule B, after By-law No. 11:—

12. Where any premises are a "dairy" within the meaning of section 6 (18) of the Public Health and Buildings Ordinance, 1903, solely by reason of the fact that milk is supplied from or kept in such premises for purposes of sale, the Board may exempt such premises from the provision of by-laws Nos. 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 9, and 11 of these by-laws, or any of them, if the Board is satisfied that such milk is sold or intended to be sold only in sealed bottles obtained direct from a registered dairy and kept intact as so received. Any exemption may be withdrawn by the Board at its discretion.
