ORDINANCE No. 1 of 1903. - (PUBLIC HEALTH AND BUILDINGS).

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 16 of the Public Health and Buildings Ordinance, 1903, the Sanitary Board makes the following amendment of the by-laws under the heading "Prevention and mitigation of epidemic, endemic, contagious or infectious disease" set forth in Schedule B to the above-mentioned Ordinance as amended by Notification No. 714 in the Gazette of the 31st December, 1926:—

Add to by-law No. 9 the following:—

- (d) No person shall without the written permission of the Head of the Sanitary Department and the Medical Officer of Health sell or offer for sale any non-aerated drinks in the preparation of which fruit juice or herbs (other than tea) are used.
- (e) No person shall without the written permission of the Head of the Sanitary Department and the Medical Officer of Health sell or offer for sale the jellies known as Leung Fan (京粉) and Man Tau Lo (饅頭蘿).
