ORDINANCE No. 10 of 1899. (MERCHANT SHIPPING).

In exercise of the powers conferred by sections 25 (4) and 42 (1) of the Merchant Shipping Ordinance, 1899, the Governor in Council hereby further amends Table M in the Schedule to the said Ordinance by the rescission of the boundaries of the Special Quarantine Anchorage, as set out in the second amendment in Notification No. 264 published in the Gazette of the 21st April, 1933, and the substitution of the following boundaries therefor:—

⁽²⁾ No vehicle shall be deemed to be substantially manufactured within the British Empire unless, in the opinion of the Inspector General of Police, at least one quarter, or such other proportion as the Governor in Council may fix by Order, of its value is the result of labour within the British Empire.
