

PROCLAMATION.

No. 3.

Whereas the office of the District Officer for the Southern District of the New Territories has been moved from the building known as "The Government Offices" situate in Pedder Street, Victoria, in this Colony, to the first floor of the building known as St. George's Building, at the corner of Chater Road and Ice House Street, Victoria aforesaid, and it is expedient that the present office should be appointed and declared to be a court-house for all purposes and functions of a magistrate:

And Whereas it is convenient (without prejudice to any previous proclamation, notification or authorization) that all the court-houses of magistrates in this Colony should be included in this proclamation:

Now therefore I Sir WILLIAM PEEL, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Hong Kong and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same, do hereby appoint the following several places as Court-houses where a magistrate may sit to hear and try and determine and deal with complaints and informations and other matters to be heard and tried and determined and dealt with by him as a magistrate in an open court, including, where the magistrate is authorised for the purpose, the holding of a Small Debts Court as mentioned in section 58 of the New Territories Regulation Ordinance, 1910.

1. The Magistracy, Victoria.
2. The Marine Magistrates Court, Harbour Office Building, Victoria.
3. The Magistracy, Kowloon.
4. The Magistracy, Taipo.
5. The Charge Room at the Police Station at Ping Shan in the Northern District of the New Territories.
6. The District Land Office at Ping Shan in the Northern District of the New Territories.
7. The Charge Room at the Police Station at Au Tau in the Northern District of the New Territories.
8. The Charge Room at the Police Station at Sheung Shui in the Northern District of the New Territories.
9. The Charge Room at the Police Station at Lok Ma Chau in the Northern District of the New Territories.
10. The Charge Room at the Police Station at Castle Peak in the Northern District of the New Territories.
11. The Charge Room at the Police Station at Sha Tau Kok in the Northern District of the New Territories.
12. The Charge Room at the Police Station at Sai Kung in the Northern District of the New Territories.
13. The Office of the District Officer for the Southern District of the New Territories, in the building known as "St. George's Building", situate at the corner of Chater Road and Ice House Street, Victoria.

15. The Charge Room at the Police Station at Tai O, Lantau, in the Southern District of the New Territories.
16. The Charge Room at the Police Station at Cheung Chau in the Southern District of the New Territories.
17. The building formerly used as a Police Station at Tung Chung, Lantau, in the Southern District of the New Territories.
18. The building formerly used as a Police Station at Yung Shü Wan on Lamma Island in the Southern District of the New Territories.

ORDINANCE No. 1 of 1903. (PUBLIC HEALTH AND BUILDINGS).

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 72 of the Public Health and Buildings Ordinance, 1903, and it appearing to be convenient that the markets established since the commencement of the said Ordinance should be set out in this notification, the Governor in Council hereby declares the markets mentioned in Part I of the List hereunder to be markets established under the provisions of the said Ordinance, and the markets mentioned in Part II of the said List to be closed.
