ORDINANCE No. 1 of 1931. (NURSES REGISTRATION).

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Nurses Registration Ordinance, 1931, the Governor in Council makes the following further amendments of the regulations made under the said Ordinance and published as Notification No. 321 in the Gazette of the 22nd May, 1931:—

Amendments.

(1) The following proviso is added at the end of regulation 5:—

Provided that nurses and dressers, in the service of the Government of Hong Kong, shall be exempt from payment of such fee.

(2) The following proviso is added at the end of paragraph (1) of regulation 6:--

Provided that nurses and dressers, while in the service of the Government of Hong Kong, shall be exempt from payment of such retention fee.
