ORDINANCE No. 1 of 1932. (JUVENILE OFFENDERS).

In further exercise of the powers conferred by section 3 (5) of the Juvenile Offenders Ordinance, 1932, the Governor in Council, by this Order, establishes as a juvenile court the Magistrate's Court at Ping Shan Land Office, and assigns to such court, as an alternative to the juvenile court at the Magistracy at Taipo, the Lok Ma Chau, Au Tau and Ping Shan Police Districts of the Northern District of the New Territories.

ORDINANCE No. 7 of 1906. (PROSPECTING AND MINING).
