ORDINANCE No. 25 of 1927. (PRINTERS AND PUBLISHERS).

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 3 (1) of the Printers and Publishers Ordinance, 1927, as enacted by the Printers and Publishers Amendment Ordinance, 1934, the Governor in Council makes the following regulations:—

Regulations.

Exemptions.

1. Machines and apparatus not of a kind designed or intended for use by printers in the carrying on of the trade or business of a printer, unless used or intended to be used by a person in substitution for a printer's press and with a view to the publication and circulation of books, newspapers or pamphlets, are exempted from the provisions of the Printers and Publishers Ordinance, 1927.

Fees.

2. The fee for a licence to keep printing presses with a view to sale or hire (in these regulations referred to as a Class I licence) shall be \$50 for a year or part of a year. The fee for any other licence granted under section 5 of the said Ordinance (in these regulations referred to as a Class II licence) shall be \$10 for a year or part of a year.

Records to be kept. 3. In the case of every Class I licence the licensee shall keep an up-to-date record of all his dealings and transactions relating to the printing presses, and parts of printing presses, kept by him, which record shall include particulars of the names and addresses of all purchasers and hirers, and the places of delivery and intended destination of every printing press or part of a printing press removed from the place specified in the licence. Such record, and the licensee's stock of printing presses and parts of printing presses shall be produced by the licensee to the Inspector General of Police, or to any police officer deputed by him in that behalf, on demand.

Records, etc. to be produced.

Restriction

Class I licence.

4. Except with the permission of the Inspector General of Police, first obtained, no printing press or part of a printing press in respect of which a Class I licence shall have been issued shall be removed from the place specified in the licence unless such removal is in respect of a bonâ fide sale or hiring, duly recorded in accordance with regulation 3 of these regulations.

- 5. Except with the permission of the Inspector General Restriction of Police, first obtained, no printing press or part of a print-moval. ing press in respect of which a Class II licence shall have Class II been issued shall be removed from the place specified in the licence.
- 6. These regulations shall come into operation on the Commence-1st day of January, 1935.

ORDINANCE No. 7 of 1929. (SUNDAY CARGO WORKING).

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Sunday Cargo Working Ordinance, 1929, the Governor in Council adds the following paragraph to the scale of fees for Sunday permits set forth in Government Notification No. 702 published in the Gazette of the 28th November, 1930.

Addition.

Proportionate fees are hereby authorised, and shall be charged as follows:—

Where the working is limited to

- (a) midnight to 6 a.m.one quarter of the scale fee.
- (b) 6 a.m. to 6 p.m.one half of the scale fee.
- (c) 6 p.m. to midnightone quarter of the scale fee.

This enactment shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1935.
