## Hong Kong.

ORDINANCE No. 36 of 1931. (LIQUORS).

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 88 of the Liquors Ordinance, 1931, the Governor in Council alters Form No. 5 in the First Schedule to the said Ordinance by rescinding Condition No. 3 therein and substituting the following Condition therefor:—

- 3. Intoxicating liquors shall only be sold between the following hours and at no other time:—
- (a) In that part of the City of Victoria situated to the east of Arsenal Street, between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m.
- (b) Elsewhere in the Colony, between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and between 7 p.m. and 10 p.m.

Provided that the Inspector General of Police in his discretion and where the licensed premises or a portion thereof are reserved for a private party may grant a permit in writing permitting the sale of liquor on the premises or portion so reserved to members of such party up till 1 a.m. on payment of the Official Signatures fee of \$5 or beyond that hour on payment of the fee prescribed in the Second Schedule to the Ordinance.
