The first week-day in July
The first Monday in AugustMonday, 7th August.
The first Monday in September
The tenth day of October, or if that day should be a Sunday, then the following day
Armistice Day, or if that day should be a Sunday, then the following day
Christmas Day, or if that day should be a Sunday, then the following day
The twenty-sixth day of December, or if that day should be a Sunday, then the following day, or if Christmas Day should be a Sunday, then the Tuesday following Christmas Day

It is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to exclude the Magistrates from the operation of the Holidays Ordinance, 1912, Ordinance No. 5 of 1912, on the 2nd January, 20th February, 8th and 10th April, 29th May, 1st July, 7th August, 4th September, 11th November and 26th December.

The Imports and Exports Department will be open for the purpose of Revenue collection and issue of permits only from 9 a.m. to 12 Noon on all the above days except Sundays, Chinese New Year's Day, Good Friday, 10th October and Christmas Day.
