Item No. 191:—Miscellaneous Services.—Depreciation of Sterling Securities, \$144,986.00.

THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS.—It has been tried out and found to be very unsatisfactory at Cape d'Aguilar so they are going to move it to the Peak.
